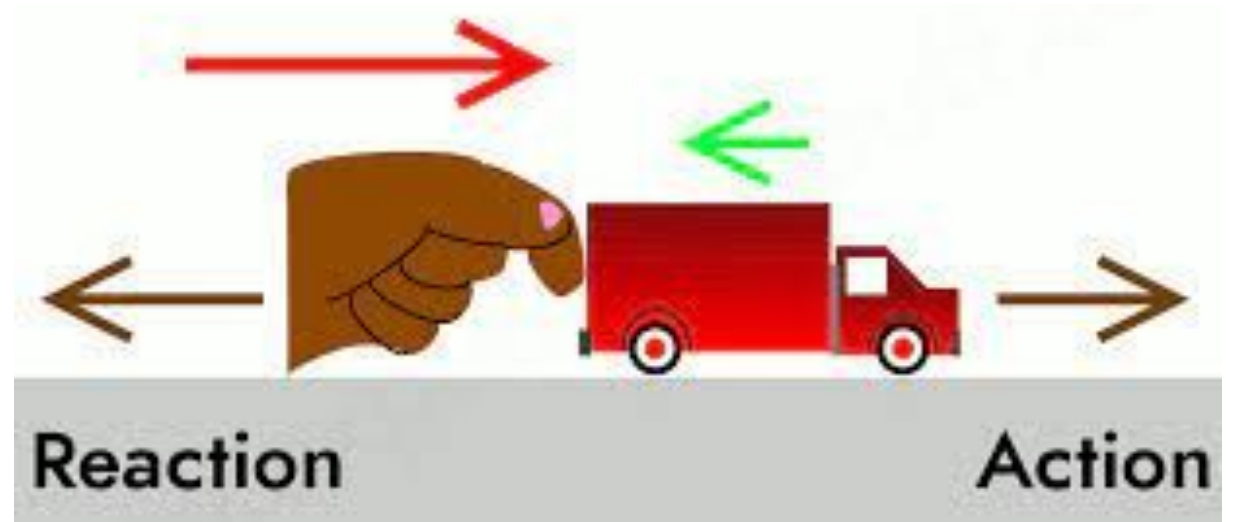

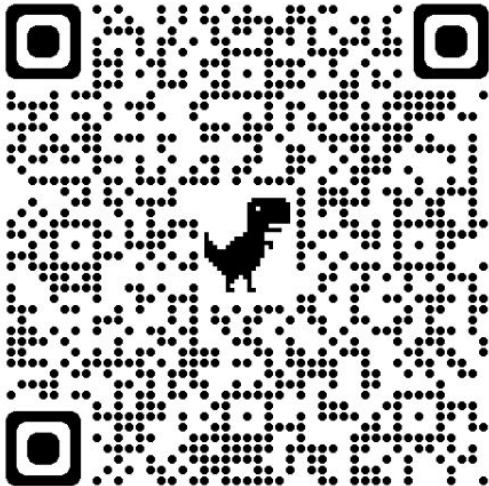

Grading and Reporting

Balanced Assessment Approach

- Projects

Student understanding is assessed in multiple ways. Each assessment type provides information to guide and inform instruction to meet the needs of students.

Parent/Teacher Communication

Teachers remain in contact with parents throughout each quarter to share and monitor student progress.

Elementary Progress Report

- Achievement Grade
- Effort Grade
- Life, Work & Citizenship

The progress report reflects the student's current level of understanding and demonstration of knowledge and skills.

Elementary Progress Report Marks

4 Consistently demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

- Frequency of behavior, nearly all the time
- Requires no support when demonstrating understanding
- Demonstrates a thorough understanding of content taught
- Makes no major errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts or processes taught

3 Usually demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

- Frequency of behavior, most of the time
- Requires limited support when demonstrating understanding
- Demonstrates a general understanding of content taught
- Makes few major errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts or processes

2 Sometimes demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

- Frequency of behavior, some of the time
- Requires moderate support in order to demonstrate understanding of concepts and skills
- Demonstrates a partial understanding of content taught
- Makes some errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts or processes

1 Seldom demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

- Frequency of behavior, seldom
- Requires considerable support in order to demonstrate learning of concepts and skills
- Demonstrates limited understanding of concepts, skills, and processes taught
- Makes frequent major errors when demonstrating concepts or processes

Homework

- Weekly packet with skills practice
 - Other assignments throughout the week as needed
 - Study Guides
- *Students will be responsible for copying down assignments and due dates in their agendas.

Grading and Assessment:

- Exit tickets and quizzes
- Unit assessment (Performance Matters or Schoology)

- Interims and Report Cards

*End of quarter grades reflect the most recent grades/achievement

Communication Methods

Communication: We will send a weekly newsletter via email on Sunday or Monday.

Procedures: We will continue to follow the Hawk's Pledge. Students must also adhere to the SR&R.

Attendance: Attendance is taken Monday-Friday. Please be **ON TIME** daily.

School Communication

- **E-Notify** – This system allows us to send a call, text or email to all Hayfield ES parents. We use this for essential and critical communication that we feel is important for all families to receive.
- **News You Choose** – This system allows any member of our community to sign up to receive email updates on topics that are important to them. It is up to you whether you want to subscribe to the various email updates hence the name “News You Choose.” Our bi-monthly *School House News* is sent via News You Choose as well as news from our Hayfield ES PTA. Transportation

Parents/guardians MUST complete the online [Temporary Dismissal Change form](#) when a child's normal dismissal will change for the day.
