








Welcome to THIRD GRADE

In my spare time I enjoy traveling, reading and spending time with my family. Some of my hobbies are knitting, rock climbing, and acting.



Elementary Progress Report

The progress report reflects the student's current level of understanding and demonstration of knowledge and skills.

Elementary Progress Report Marks

- 1 Seldom demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter
 - Frequency of behavior, seldom
 - Requires considerable support in order to demonstrate learning of concepts and skills
 - Demonstrates limited understanding of concepts, skills, and processes taught
 - Makes frequent major errors when demonstrating concepts or processes
- 2 Sometimes demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter
 - Frequency of behavior, some of the time
 - Requires moderate support in order to demonstrate understanding of concepts and skills
 - Demonstrates a partial understanding of content taught
 - Makes some errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts or processes
- 3 Usually demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter
 - Frequency of behavior, most of the time
 - Requires limited support when demonstrating understanding
 - Demonstrates a general understanding off content taught
 - Makes few major errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts or processes
- 4 Consistently demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter
 - Frequency of behavior, nearly all the time
 - Requires no support when demonstrating understanding
 - Demonstrates a thorough understanding of content taught
 - Makes no major errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts or processes taught

Grading and Assessment

- Progress Report: TBD We are awaiting more information from FCPS First Quarter Ends on November 3rd.
- Interims: Mid-grading period. Emailed to parent(s) as a PDF <u>IF</u> needed.
 Purpose of interims is to make sure parents are aware of areas where their child is struggling. These are areas where the child might be getting a 1 or 2 on the progress report. An interim will not be sent for every child. Interims can be for both academic and/or behavioral needs.
- Teachers will also communicate about student academic and behavioral progress as needed.
- Please note that grades will not be posted within Schoology.

Volunteers:

- Please contact the PTA if you wish to serve as a room parent.
- Other volunteer opportunities will be available throughout the school year.
- Sign-up Genius for Thursday Folders.

Homework:

- Homework will start the second week of school.
- It will consist of reading skills, math skills, and independent reading with a response.
- Students should read independently for at least 15 minutes each day.
- Homework should take up no more than 30 minutes of time each school day. Please try not to complete the packet in one night.
- It will be sent home on Monday to be returned on the last day of the week.
- Homework will be used to develop responsibility and independence.
- Teachers will not grade homework, but turn in and completion will be recorded.

Recess:

- Recess will be 30 minutes each day.
- Recess will be outside as weather allows.
- Please ensure students are dressed appropriately for the weather.
- Please do not allow students to bring in extra equipment and toys from home. All recess equipment is supplied by the school.

Snacks:

- All snacks must be nut free.
- Snacks should be items that can be eaten quickly while working and students can manage on their own.
- Extra snacks will not be kept in the classroom.
- Snacks should be "clean" and not require a utensil.
- Examples:
 - carrot sticks
 - apple slices
 - pretzels
 - veggie straws
 - grapes

Birthdays:

- We love to celebrate birthdays in 3rd grade!
- If you would like to send in a treat for your student's birthday, please let your teacher know.
- We prefer non-food treats due to allergies within the classroom, but if you

Food Services:


- Free and Reduced applications are due to the county by October 4th.
- Anyone student previously enrolled, is approved until September 30th.
- Students will use their pin number to access their accounts.
- Families should set up a <u>MySchoolBucks</u> account (link is on the school website).

Personal Devices:

- Phones must be silenced and in backpacks for the duration of the school day.
- Smart watches that serve a dual purpose may be worn, but the phone features (texting, Internet viewing, and calls) are to be off when phone use is prohibited. Students are prohibited from using phones, tablets, and other mobile devices in restrooms and locker rooms, unless there is a medical necessity or emergency.
- Teachers may allow usage of cell phones for instructional activities when appropriate.
