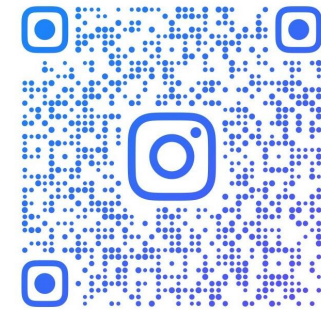

Transportation Process

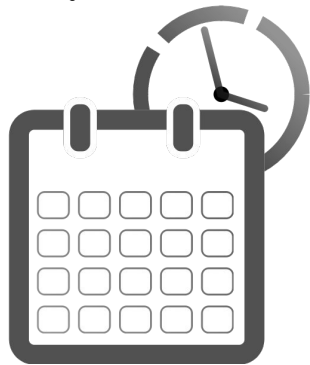


- Permanent Dismissal Form 2023-2024

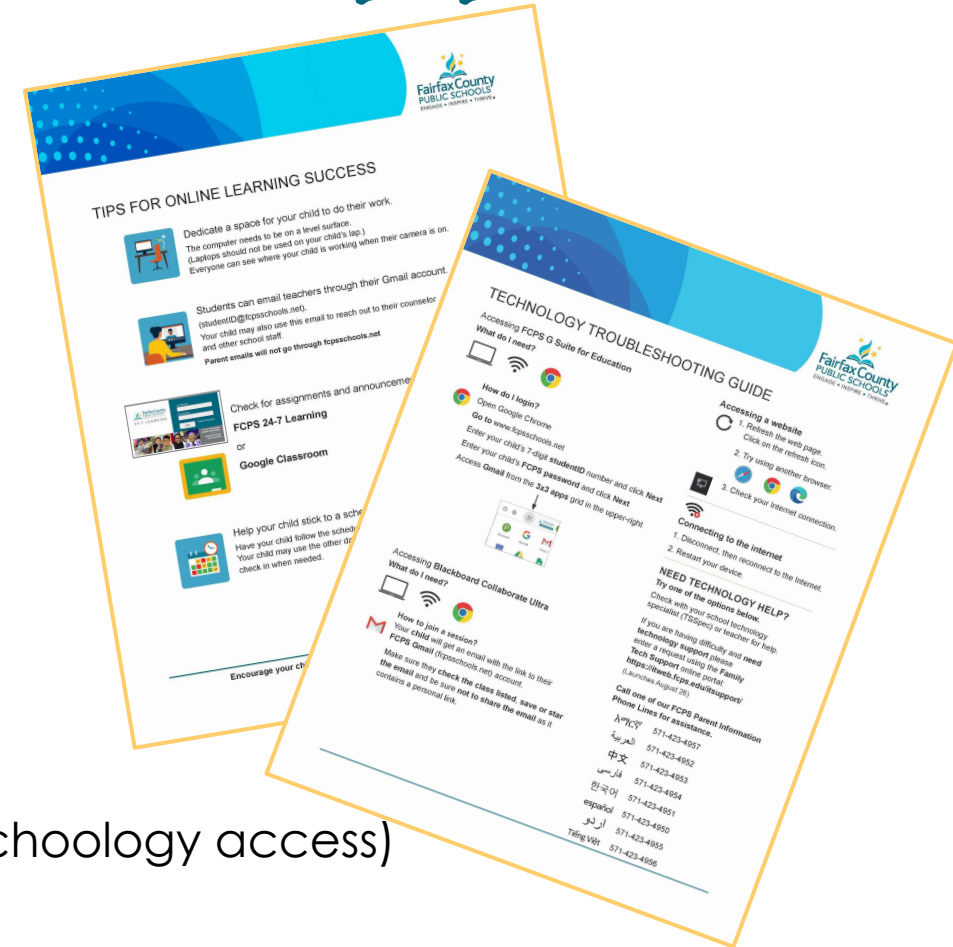

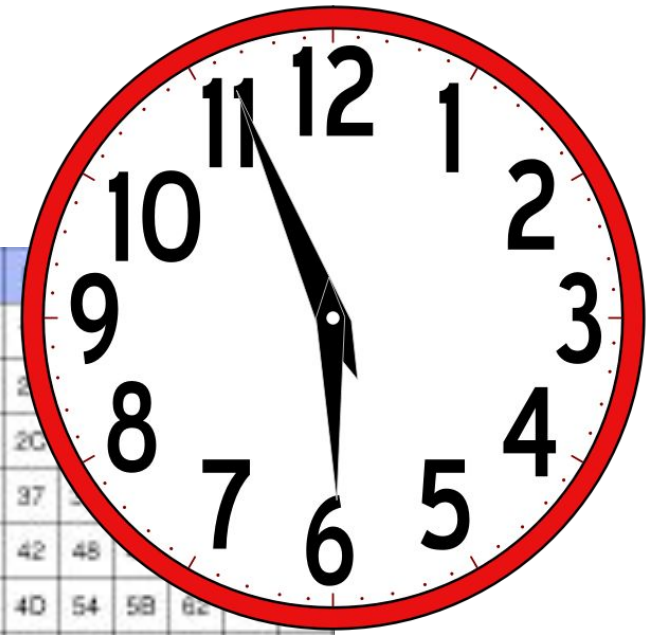
